STORY

Rashash is a renegade born in the deserts of Saudi Arabia. Destiny drives the ambitions of this corrupted soldier to take a path towards ever escalating crimes. He wants to forge his name in history at all costs.

Others will follow him on this criminal crusade into the desert. *Rashash* is a born leader who will only lead them into chaos and destruction. Among his gang are members of family, drug cartel, and petty criminals. A dangerous fate brings them together, if they choose to follow him, it will be a path none of them can come back from.

At the center of the drama is young police officer Fahd. In the wake of *Rashash's* violent ambitions, Fahd is driven to pursue justice for his partner. Fahd's tenacity and new ways of thinking grate against the traditions of his family and his fellow police community.

From our explosive opening car chase to the hijacking of an Oil-Tanker, Armoured Truck and gun-frenzied police shoot out. We will consistently balance the thrilling action with the human emotion where lingering on a certain gesture or reaction will convey a multitude of sentiments.

Long shadowy dusks, menacing darkness and glorious morning desert skylines will create a smouldering, expansive, sweltering and at times oppressive mood, as we observe our characters and let their fears, doubts, happiness and joy in a given situation touch us emotionally.

In terms of capturing blood and brutality, the show is more suggestive. We will concentrate on the human and emotional side, the physical details; the consequences and aftermath, reaction and shock to each crime or murder.

Design is pushed towards a contemporary late 1980's period; the police station, interview rooms, city houses and living areas are firmly in the 80's period and not heighten in style or palate.


There will be a consistent tone and look to Rashash that will feel unified and help create a signature new series, a symbiotic study between Police and Criminals, Good and Evil.



Filmed in the breath-taking Saudi Arabian landscape, this high-end and dynamic drama series is one of the biggest TV productions to ever be produced in the Middle East.




